STEWARD - We hold 1,600 acres of conserved lands with 14 free public access preserves, with trails and water access. We are the water stewards of the Presumpscot River watershed, and we coordinate the Sebago the Sea Trail, a 28-mile trail from Standish to Portland.

ENGAGE - We provide free monthly education programs for the public, families and schools on our trails in the outdoors.

OUTDOOR DESTINATIONS

BLACK BROOK PRESERVE

Scenic wildlife viewing trail

Trail: 2.5 mile, network Difficulty: Easy-Moderate

Highlights: Mature forests, extensive wetlands, and abundant wildlife in Windham Center.

Directions: Along Windham Center Road south of intersection with Route 202, Windham.

FRAZIER PRESERVE

Family friendly walking rail trail

Trail: 0.75 miles, one way

Difficulty: Easy

Highlights: Wide forested trail in downtown Gorham, accessible for all-terrain strollers.

Directions: Along Access Road to Gorham High

School off Route 202, Gorham.

GAMBO PRESERVE

Scenic walk through history

Trail: 1-2 miles, round trip

Difficulty: Easy

Highlights: Gunpowder mill ruins and Cumberland-Oxford Canal Towpath.

Directions: End of Gambo Road, Windham or end of Partridge Lane at Shaw Park, Gorham.

HAWKES PRESERVE

River paddling destination

Trail: 1 mile, loop

Difficulty: Easy-Moderate

Highlights: Scenic views of the Presumpscot River, car-top boat launch with miles of paddling.

Directions: End of Towpath Road, Gorham or at Great Falls Elementary School, Gorham (park in the school parking lot farthest from the school).

MILL BROOK PRESERVE

Hiking & trail running destination

Trail: 6 mile network

Difficulty: Moderate-Challenging

Highlights: Scenic brook and forest, view the largest fish migration from Casco Bay each spring.

Directions: North trailhead: Methodist Rd at Rt 302; Center trailheads: Willow Dr and Methodist Rd; South trailhead: Perry Court, Westbrook.

RANDALL ORCHARDS

Apple picking destination

Trail: 1.5 mile, loop Difficulty: Easy-Moderate

Highlights: Enjoy sweeping views at this 500-acre forever conserved family run orchard, farm & forest.

Directions: 1 Randall Rd or Colonial Marketplace,

Standish.

SEBAGO TO THE SEA TRAIL – GORHAM/WINDHAM

Scenic biking on a paved rail trail

Trail: 4 miles of paved rail trail, one way plus 1.5 miles of gravel rail trail, one-way.

Difficulty: Easy

Highlights: Enjoy the scenic countryside and views of the Presumpscot River on this paved trail.

Directions: End of Gambo Road, Windham or Partridge Lane at Shaw Park, Gorham.

SEBAGO TO THE SEA TRAIL – STANDISH

Remote swimming beach destination

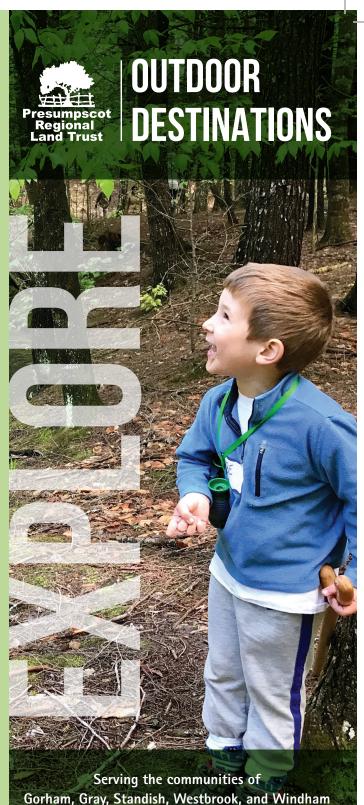
Trail: 2.8 miles, one way Difficulty: Easy-Moderate

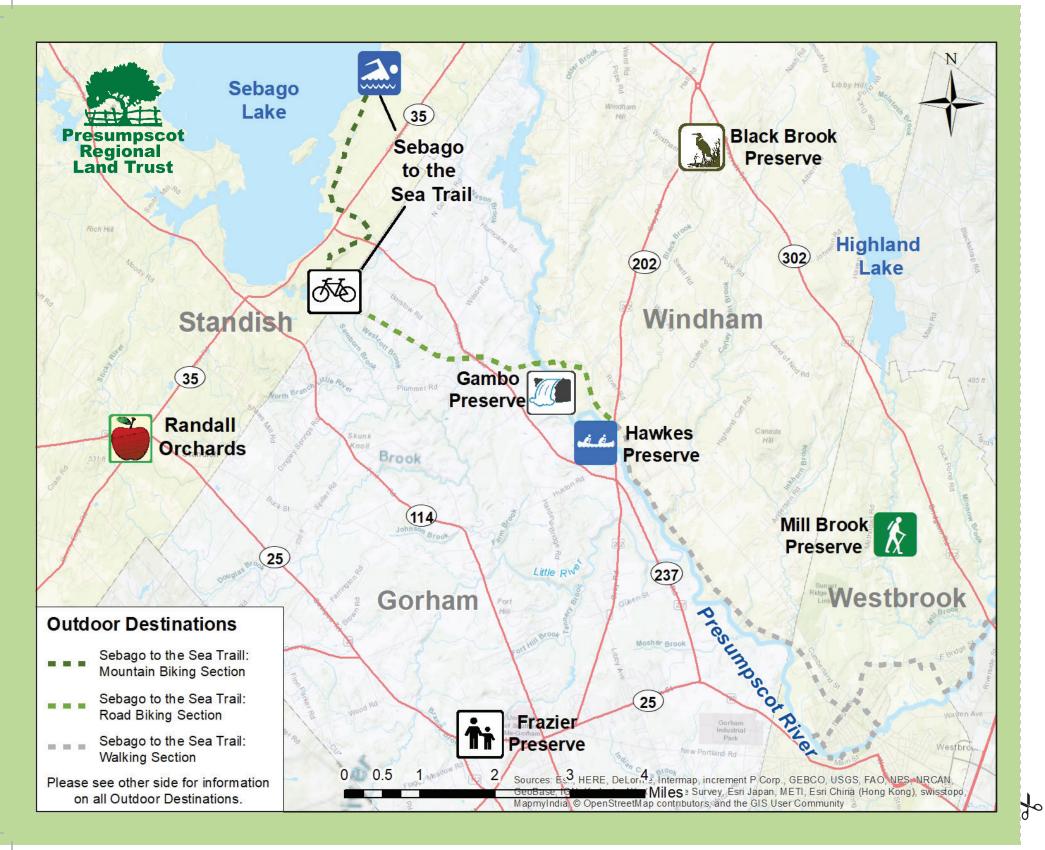
Highlights: Mountain bike 5.6 miles round trip to a remote Sebago Lake swimming beach.

Directions: Along Route 237, half a mile East of Route 35, park at the lot owned by Portland Water

District, Standish. Sign in at kiosk.
